


Read / Write VPD SOP


For some cases, the NAS lost its VPD or missing VPD during RMA process. This will cause the NAS working improperly.

Symptom : search NAS by Qfinder, find NAS model name display X for bay number and MAC address display "00-00-00-00-05-09".




Solution : Please follow below steps write VPD to NAS again.

- Open Putty
- Key in NAS IP




- Log in username and password of NAS.



Below command examples for reading and writing VPD from / to NAS.

- **Read motherboard VPD**
`[~] # hal_app --vpd_get_field obj_index=0:4`
`field<0:4> = 70-0QW560130`
- **Read backplane board VPD**
`[~] # hal_app --vpd_get_field obj_index=1:7`
`field<1:7> = 70-1QW670120`
- **Write motherboard VPD**
`[~] # hal_app --vpd_set_field obj_index=0:4,value=xx-xxxxxxxx`
 Where xx-xxxxxxxx: the motherboard 70-level part number (EX: 70-0QW560130)
- **Write backplane board VPD**
`[~] # hal_app --vpd_set_field obj_index=1:7,value=xx-xxxxxxxx`
 Where xx-xxxxxxxx: the backplane board 70-level part number (EX: 70-1QW670120)
- When write command is finished, please reboot NAS.
- After reboot, please search NAS and make sure model name and MAC address if correct or not.
